

Inkaterra Opens Hacienda Concepcion Wilderness Lodge in the Peruvian Amazon

Hacienda Concepcion, Inkaterra's fifth hotel in Peru, has officially opened on the banks of the Madre de Dios Waterway.

With its opening, Hacienda Concepcion becomes the second material goods under the more affordable, budget-friendly 'bylnkaterra' sub-brand, joining El MaPi, in Machu Picchu Pueblo. Both maintain the brand's commitment to conservation and responsible visiting the attractions, while providing sophisticated lodging at a decrease price point.

Diffident and yet reachable, the new Hacienda Concepcion caters to scenery-loving enthusiasts who visit the region in search of an authentic jungle experience, but are I don't know conscious of time and budgetary constraints. A "roughing it lacking roughing it" lodge, Hacienda Concepcion's amenities include hot drizzle showers, Peruvian cotton linens and the same practiced guides from Inkaterra hotels.

Twenty synopsis down waterway from Puerto Maldonado, the new Hacienda Concepcion features a main lodge, with eight twin rooms and shared spaces, and seven have fun cabañas on stills designed in the local style. With soaring ceilings, a hand-woven thatched roof and furniture crafted from salvaged wood, the main lodge will also be family to Hacienda Concepcion's main dining room and reception.

Hacienda Concepcion is located on over 2,000 acres of lush rainforest within walking distance of Lake Sandoval (family to the endangered giant waterway otter) and offers a unique array of land and waterway excursions. While staying at Hacienda Concepcion, guests will have the opportunity to spot prehistoric hoatzins, various species of monkey and a superfluity of other wildlife. In addition to wildlife experiences, guests will also be capable to learn about the lodge's history and its botanical gardens featuring local medicinal plants.
