

Sustainable Management at Inkaterra hotels as reference for the IDB project (Inter-American Development Bank)

Twenty four tourism entrepreneurs based at the central Peruvian jungle, visited the operational areas of the Inkaterra and byInkaterra Hotels in Machu Picchu to learn about good practices in sustainable tourism at an important destination as Machu Picchu. This benchmarking activity took place on January 20 – 21st and was part of the Project “Competitiveness of Tourism Services for the Development of the Peruvian Central Jungle” financed by the Inter-American Development Bank.

Inkaterra and Inkaterra Association (ITA) supported the visit of these young entrepreneurs, who made contact with the teams of the different areas of the hotels, exchanging experiences and identifying the difficulties and challenges of sustainable management.



Forest Sciences and Tourism Students: Internship at Casa ITA Biological Station

Forestry Sciences School students of Universidad Nacional Agraria La Molina (National Agrarian La Molina University), and Tourism and Hotel Management School students of Universidad San Martín de Porres (San Martín de Porres University), are doing their internship at CASA ITA biological station in Tambopata – Madre de Dios, as part of ITA's Volunteering Program, to develop research and tourism projects.

The Forest Sciences students are studying the floristic composition of Amazon forests through the creation of inventories at the stations, strengthening their research skills and contributing to the botanic knowledge of this area.



The Tourism students are developing a project that applies sustainable tourism criteria to the Volunteering Program of ITA, improving the use of good practices of the research stations in Madre de Dios.
