ITA presents proposal for the creation of a Marine Protected Area in the tropical sea of Peru

The tropical sea of Peru is one of the richest seas of the world, home of important and endangered species as whales, dolphins, turtles and sharks and breathtaking landscapes. This area faces overfishing problems, contamination, and oil exploitation. In the region of Piura citizens and organizations have been working for the marine biodiversity conservation, especially the Máncora district, Organos and Cabo Blanco.

The proposal developed by Inkaterra Asociación (ITA), for the creation of a Marine Protected Area attempts to protect and optimize the marine biodiversity management as well as other economic activities in the tropical sea of Peru. After this meeting, many participants including associated local fishermen, sent to the government authorities letters for supporting this proposal.
