DAY 1

INKATERRA MACHU PICCHU
PUBLO HOTEL



Upon arrival to Machu Picchu train station, you will be greeted by our staff and taken to Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel.



Lunch in the dining room.

In the afternoon, transfer to the bus station for a 25-minute trip to Machu Picchu to enjoy a private guided visit through the world renowned Inca Citadel, and one of the best spots to find the endemic Inca Wren.

Return to the hotel.

Dinner and overnight in the comfort of your casita at Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel - / L / D

DAY 2

06:00 a.m. a four-hour excursion will take you along the Vilcanota river into the Mandor Valley, inhabited by varied and fascinating birdlife, like the Andean guan, Green jay, colourful tanagers among others. Relax enjoying the Mandor waterfall, before walking back to the hotel in the shadow of Machu Picchu.

Return to the hotel for lunch at the main restaurant.

After lunch, birding at the hotel gardens is a good option to find tanagers, hummingbirds or the emblematic Andean cock of the rock. You can find also the world's largest collection of native orchid species in their natural setting within a private facility (372 species).

DAY 3

Breakfast buffet at the main restaurant.

Walk early in the morning to take advantage of the optimum time for cloud-forest bird watching. Begin at a river observatory, with the possibility of sighting the sought-after Torrent duck and the White-capped dipper. Then proceed to a productive tanager feeding area, where Silver-beaked, blue-necked, Fawn-breasted and Saffron-crowned tanagers can be found. Along the hotel's pathways, be on the lookout for the Cock-of-the-rock, the Golden-headed quetzal and many of the 18 different hummingbirds identified on the grounds, including the Booted racket-tail and the Green-and-white hummingbirds, which are native to the area.

Lunch at the main restaurant.

In due time our staff will assist you back to the train station to take your train to Cusco.

Note: This is a basic itinerary which can serve as an inspiration for your trip to Peru. Additional nights may be considered for a more relaxed experience; additional destinations are available upon request.
