The organic farm covers four acres of land surrounding the property where guests are welcomed to harvest quinoa of varieties red, black, and brown; artichoke, natural Urubamba giant corn, purple corn, potatoes, onions, beans, and broccoli. Each product has been planted and harvested utilizing ancient techniques, native to the Sacred Valley.

As for activities, the valley is home to over 30 bird species; a bird-lover's paradise. If one is looking to exert more energy, the region offers eco-adventure sports such as hiking, horseback riding, mountain biking, and river rafting.
