







The Inkaterra is hands down where you need to lay your head. But it's more than a place to sleep. They have guides on staff to take you on a specialized tour of Machu

Picchu! You'll wake up hours before the sun and board a bus that will take you up to the top of the mountain. We didn't do the long hike up to the top because we were on a timeline, but if you're into walking/hiking then you should wake up even earlier and do the assent by foot. But even if you opt for the bus route, you'll still have a tiny hike to get to the viewing area. Get ready for some epic photos – Machu Picchu is EVERYTHING! It's easy to spend a half day roaming the ruins and learning about the history and people that went into every detail. WHATEVER YOU DO – promise me that you'll take the early wake up call and head up the mountain while it's still dark. Sitting at the top and waiting for the sun to rise was beyond belief.






















Everything about our short time here was magical and I can promise you that when you go, you'll be just as wowed!
