How-ever, the cost of living is not cheap: a one-bedroom flat costs £350,000, a loaf of bread is £5.50, a pint of beer in a hotel can cost £11 and I paid £77 for a bottle of unremarkable red wine from California

This summer the tourist board is hoping the lure of the America's Cup will provide a fly-on-the-wall commercial for the island. 'Our calculations project the Cup could be worth \$400 million [£310 million] to Bermuda,' says Winfield.
