Inkaterra Cabo Blanco restarts construction

Months after the El Niño Phenomenon's impact over Northern Peru, Inkaterra Cabo Blanco restarted its construction plan aiming to open on summer 2019.

Prioritizing harmony with the natural landscape and the use of surface in efficient ways, Inkaterra has continued building a 11,520m³ rock wall across the property, avoiding the use of cement.

The design of these stone platforms is inspired in pre-Hispanic architecture established in the Peruvian coast. Inkaterra is also growing native flora for a dry forest environment that will create an ancestral sense of place, aiming to entice the comeback of native biodiversity as practiced in other Inkaterra destinations.
