3. Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica – Puerto Maldonado, Peru

Forn the most adventurous groom, there's the Amazon Jungle. Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica is an eco-luxury lodge in front of the Madre de Dios River in the lush Tambopata region in Peru. This 35-cabin resort comes with a menu of a la carte excursions including various hikes and a visit to the Inkaterra Canopy Walkway, 98 feet above the ground, during which guests can spot anacondas, tarantulas, jaguars, and more.

4. Africa House at Royal Malewane – Kruger National Park, South Africa

Set on a private island in South Africa's Greater Kruger National Park, Africa House is a former private home turned six-bedroom resort boasting a private chef, pool, staff and access by jeep to the nearby main lodge, which offers fitness and spa facilities. The private section of African bush is also known to attract a slew of wildlife, including cheetahs and elephants who drink from the nearby pools.

5. Dunton River Camp - Cresto Ranch, Colorado

7. The Craigellachie Hotel - Speyside, Scotland
