It is more than a little sad that the first thing that springs to mind when I think of Peru is

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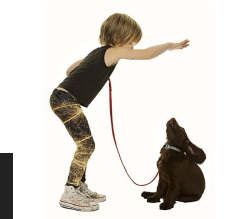


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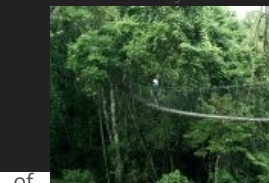
