KIDSBEHIND HALF OF ALLKNIFE CRIME

AGED BETWEEN 15 AND 19

» 8% OF OFFENDERS IN LONDON ARE 10 TO 14

HALF of all knife crime offenders in London are teenagers or even younger children, Metropolitan Police figures reveal.

The stark illustration of the scale of youth violence in the capital shows that 41 per cent of those being caught for knife crimes are aged between 15 and 19. Another eight per cent are younger still, ranging in age from 10 to 14 — a further sign of how carrying blades has become part of life for a minority of troubled youngsters.

The figures were published as a Scotland Yard chief warned that attacks in the capital were becoming "more ferocious" as increasingly younger offenders tried to kill or injure by "getting up close and stabbing someone several times".

Chief Superintendent Ade Adelekan, head of the Met's Violent Crime Task Force, said police were "making some progress" by upping stop and search and using other tactics, such as the deployment of "embedded" undercover officers to the worst-hit communities, to intervene

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



Where to stay



Alpaca your suitcase



THE Sacred Valley of the Incas doesn't - to the un-trained eve - have much in common with Milan Fashion Week. Purple and green mountains lurk above every hacienda, rivers wend their way past local settlements and the air is so thin your heart flutters as you walk up the gentlest hill.

And while the women's long, dark braids and brightly coloured A-line skirts are a dream to photograph, they don't immediately bring to mind the manicured Manhattanites and glossy Italian stylists who set global trends. Yet alpaca wool from the Sacred Valley, in the heart of Peru, was marched

> down the winter catwalks at Giorgio Armani, Missoni and Balenciaga, On the high street, & Other Stories, Cos and John Lewis followed suit.

Peru is climatically challenging. Over the course of two weeks I poured with sweat on Amazonian walks, burnt my face wandering Inca ruins and worried I would catch frostbite in Cusco city, 4.000 metres above sea level.

During those bouts of shuddering, I realised that most of the locals were cosily ensconced in thick patterned jumpers that are best described as feeling as soft as a baby's bottom.

"If you work with baby alpaca wool, you quickly realise it is the softest material ever," says Ilaria Niccolini, a Peru-vian specialist at production firm FTL Moda. "I would choose it over cashmere every time - and it's half the price. It's



not allergenic, so you can wear it without itching, and it's easier to dye than any other fabric." I set off to find this miracle material in Cusco, a city so steeped in history that each building wears the battle scars of the past, with Inca stones covering the bottom half of buildings and Spanish bricks the top.

I wended my way past Catholic churches and ancient ruins to San Pedro market, where flower sellers jostle for attention with cheesemongers, salt traders and a few creepy stalls selling the mummified bodies of alpacas for good luck. In the clothing section, hundreds of brightly coloured jumpers, scarves and socks were on sale, each one cheaper than a flat white in London.

Fun as San Pedro was, I quickly learned that if I wanted to buy the wool in its purest form, I needed to leave the city and drive for an hour into the Sacred Valley - specifically to Chinchero, a once-forgotten town that has become the alpaca capital of the world.

After a cup of hot Colombian coffee, we set out on a crisp morning, the altitude sickness lifting like a weight from my shoulders as we descended into the valley. Amid the spectacular scenery. small villages appeared on the roadside, with walls emblazoned with chilling adverts for guinea pig restaurants.

In Cusco I had encountered people dressed entirely in traditional clothes. Cynically, I wondered if it was done for tourists, but as we left the city I quickly realised this is not the case. Far from the prying eyes of visitors, women still wore scarlet, emerald and fuchsia wool dresses, while men dressed in woven

ponchos and felt hats.

I stayed at Inkaterra Hacienda Urubamba, a spectacular hotel deep in the Valley of the Incas. Instead of bedrooms, you stay in casitas - stone cottages dotted across the mountain slope. Each room has a roaring fire and thick alpaca rugs you can drag onto the veranda and sit under to watch sunsets.

The next morning we drove to the tiny mountaintop town of Chinchero, where

hundreds of alpacas dot the surrounding Andes, awaiting their spring shearing. "If the treatment of animals is important to you, then alpaca wool is a good option," says Niccolini. "There's no such thing as mass alpaca farming here in Peru - the animals all roam free and are treated well."

It is also a good choice if you care about female emancipation. The dyeing, weaving and selling of alpaca wool


is seen as women's work in Peru - a country that, outside of the capital. Lima, still adheres to old-fashioned gender roles. However, with the rise in global popularity of the material - 80 per cent is made in Peru - women are seeing their status change. "It's incredible to see the difference this trend has made," says Niccolini.

"Women are now making more money than men and this is transforming the

way whole communities function, as well as paying for schools and hospitals. These women already go to sourcing fairs with foreign buyers, but I want to get them to Florence and New York."

She took me to a house where, in the central courtyard, I found five women working and talking in a mix of Spanish and Quechua. They showed off jumpers. scarves and socks of the softest baby alpaca wool imaginable, and demon-











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
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strated how they dye it naturally using cochineal insects for scarlet, tree bark for orange and flowers for yellow. I bought enough to fill a small suitcase.

A week later I got back to London and had an interview scheduled with one of Britain's top fashion designers. In a fog of jetlag, I pulled on a £3 scarlet Chinchero cardigan with a pair of highwaisted jeans and set off for Dalston. As I walked into the studio, the designer





smiled. "Wow, I absolutely love your jumper," she said. "Who's it by?"
