Raja Ampat, located in Indonesia's West Papua province, is one of the world's most biodiverse marine regions, offering exceptional underwater experiences. Situated within the Coral Triangle, it is famous for its vibrant coral reefs, manta rays, pygmy seahorses, and other rare marine species.

Spring, especially March and April, marks the end of the dry season, providing calm seas and excellent underwater visibility of up to 30 meters. The period also sees fewer tourists compared to the peak season, making it an ideal time to explore this pristine paradise. Visitors often [📍.travel](#) aboard traditional Indonesian wooden sailing vessels, known as phinisi, or stay in homestays across the islands that offer direct access to coral gardens and diving sites. Birdwatching is another highlight, particularly on Batanta Island, where rare species such as the red bird of paradise can be spotted.
