The company has signed an inter-institutional agreement with the El Alto district government and the water utility EPS Grau to promote the reuse of treated wastewater for ecological projects and public green spaces.

The agreement was signed by Inkaterra founder and CEO **José Koechlin** and **Reedy Bancayan** , Mayor of El Alto. The aim of the collaboration is to develop sustainable water solutions while ensuring that wastewater treatment meets applicable environmental standards.

Water filtration by plants

The treated water will be purified using **phytodepuration systems** – a natural filtration method using plants – and then used to irrigate the tropical dry forest. This ecosystem is one of the most sensitive landscapes in northern Peru. The project aims to strengthen native tree species such as the **Peruvian carob tree (Prosopis pallida)** , which plays a vital role in the region's biodiversity.

The initiative is part of a comprehensive project to develop **Cabo Blanco into the world's first climate-neutral beach destination** .
